July 2nd – Birthday of Thurgood Marshall (Black American): well-known as a civil rights activist who served as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court

July 6th – Birthday of 14th Dalai Lama (Tibetan): Happy Birthday to a Nobel Peace Prize recipient and Tibet's leader in exile!

July 6th – Birthday of Frida Kahlo (Women, Mexican): one of the most recognizable painters of the 20th century July 7th – The Hajj (Islamic): annual pilgrimage to Mecca, that all Muslims must take at least once in their lives

July 18th – Birthday of Nelson Mandela (South African): civil rights leader for South Africa, and the country's first Black president

July 25th – Pioneer Day (Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints) observed: Utah official holiday marking the arrival of LDS church founder Brigham Young arriving to the Salt Lake area

Inspiration & Recognition Spotlight: Carlos Juan Finlay

Born: Camaguey, Cuba. December 3, 1833.



Cuban doctor and scientist Carlos Juan Finlay was a pioneer in the study of yellow fever. But back in 1881, when Finlay first presented his extensive research, suggesting that mosquitoes transmitted the disease to Havana's Academy of Sciences, he became a laughingstock. According to Finlay's son, the speech was greeted with initial silence, followed by "universal ridicule." It took another two decades before Finlay's hypothesis became widely accepted. During that time, Finlay didn't give up on his research.
