North Carolina's very own 2023 FIRST Championship, Milstein Division, Rookie All-star Award winners - FRC Team 9008 G-Force Robotics shares inspiration for outreach, personal growth and future goals - By Claire and Shelby



Recently, G-Force Robotics, an all-girl rookie team based in Clayton, N.C. won the NC State Championship Rookie All-star Award and then the Milstein Division, Rookie Allstar Award at the 2023 FIRST Championship. The team, made up of 11 young women from public, charter, home and early college schools, came together to not only build robots, but to build community through inspiring more young women to pursue STEM. Here two of their members highlight what inspires this team to perform outreach, what they learn about themselves from the experience and what they have planned for the future.

Claire - Mechanical Team and Safety Captain

While strides have been made in recent years, still only a small percentage of U.S. engineers are women. Young girls do not receive a lot of exposure to engineering; this is something that G-Force Robotics is working to change. On Saturday,



Feb. 25, 2023, we celebrated National Introduce a Girl to Engineering Day by inviting local elementary and middle school girls to our build space. These girls learned some of the many engineering skills and principles that we use to build robots as a FIRST Robotics Competition team, by doing things such as working on batteries and helping take apart an old shooter mechanism. They also got to see our 2023 season robot in action and talk to the team about our design and thought process behind it. They also got to hear from and ask

questions to two female engineers and mentors for the team, Kendra (design engineer at Caterpillar) and Callie (process engineer at Novo Nordisk), about their experiences as women in STEM.

Most of the girls we hosted had never done anything like this before. They did not know what an Allen wrench or a hex collar was. It was such an incredible introduction to engineering for these girls, but it was also an amazing experience for every member on the team to see their growth by the end of the event. While they seemed hesitant at first, it was remarkable to see these elementary and middle school girls gain confidence in their abilities. The success of this event affirms the need for more outreach like this. If more girls could get hands on engineering experience, they will know that they have a place in the STEM world. All G-Force's outreach efforts have this goal in mind. Even if our Introduce a Girl to Engineering Day efforts empowered just one girl, it was all worth it.

Shelby – Mechanical/Drive Team and Marketing Team

We are excited to be hosting the first-ever Wings Over Wayne Air Show STEM Hangar! This event will take place at the Seymour Johnson Air Force Base in Goldsboro on May 20-21, 2023. There will be close to 40 exhibitors from NASA, Caterpillar, NASCAR, Battlebots, and more! Multiple FIRST Robotics teams will be joining us to demonstrate their robots on this year's challenge field and show the wonderful world of STEM. In 2019, nearly 160,000 people attended this free, public air show. We anticipate large crowds for this event and even have a private event for about 3,000 students. We are hoping to encourage and inspire others to follow their dreams in STEM.

As a member of the marketing team, I have been creating graphics to promote the air show. I have designed monthly Instagram posts, WOW stamp cards, and a banner. I have also attended meetings on base for the planning of the event. Last September, Claire and I had the opportunity to scout the Joint Base Andrews Air Show in Maryland. We were on the lookout to see what types of booths people were attending, what activities were available, and what received the most



attention. There were a lot of NASA exhibits, so we ended up contacting them afterward.

I am inspired to do outreach to give back and enhance our community. I love having the opportunity to empower other girls in STEM! Until this team showed me so many possibilities, I had no idea that something I do for another person could impact them so significantly. My involvement with the air show has also shown me the amount of work that is put into events like these. I am so grateful to have these opportunities to show others the true meaning of teamwork and highlight FIRST to such a big audience!

May Events:

May is <u>Mental Health Awareness Month</u>, also known as Mental Health Month. Its aim is to raise awareness and educate the public about mental illnesses and reduce the stigma that surrounds mental illnesses.

May is also <u>Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month</u>, <u>ALS Awareness Month</u>, <u>National Arthritis Awareness Month</u>, and Tourette Syndrome Awareness Month

May 19: Malcolm X Day is a holiday celebrated either on May 19th, Malcolm X's birthday, or the third Friday in May, to commemorate the Civil Rights leader.

May 21: World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development is a day set aside by the United Nations as an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the values of cultural diversity and to learn to live together in harmony.

May 23 (sundown) to May 24 (sundown): Declaration of the Báb celebrates the day of declaration of the Báb, the forerunner of Bahá'u'lláh and founder of the Bahá'í faith.

May 25 (sundown) to May 27 (sundown): Shavuot is a Jewish holiday with double significance. It marks the wheat harvest in Israel and commemorates the anniversary of the day when the Jews received the Torah at Mount Sinai.

May 28: Ascension of Bahá'u'lláh commemorates the ascension of Bahá'u'lláh, the founder of the Bahá'í faith.

May 29: Memorial Day in the United States is a federal holiday established to honor military veterans.
